

TASTING NOTES:

The 2013 York Creek Petite Sirah is almost black in color with elegant aromas and flavors of juicy wild berries, plums, and hints of licorice, incense, and forest floor. It is richly textured and full bodied on the palate with powerful fruit flavors that are balanced by firm, ripe tannins leading to a long lasting finish. Build to last, expect this wine to age nicely for another 7-10 years.

THE VINEYARD:

York Creek Vineyard, named for the defining feature of the land that flows year round through the property, is located high atop the Mayacamas range of mountains on the western edge of Napa Valley north of St. Helena. Perched at 1250 – 1800 feet above sea level with well-drained soil, its unique position in the Spring Mountain District is well known for producing dark and intensely flavored wines.



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
